Overview of Wellness West

The West Side of Chicago suffers disproportionately from higher rates of chronic disease, acute ailments and mental illness. Wellness West was created to address this health inequity.

Wellness West is the coming together of proven, well-respected health care and social service providers on the West Side. Our purpose is to create an unprecedented collaboration for the uninterrupted continuity of care among hospitals, outpatient care, the social service network and community residents.

Our Model of Care

Our care delivery model is comprehensive, and we focus squarely on health equity. A shamefully persistent injustice in Chicago is that race and ethnicity are statistical predictors of virtually every health and well-being metric. This is why at the model's core are four key elements:




Who We Serve

We are focused exclusively on the West Side of Chicago, specifically in 10 zip codes, that comprise a total population of 571,902. We work with those on Medicaid or who have no health insurance.

We are focused on the following medical or behavioral conditions:

- Severe mental illness and those struggling with addiction
- or a substance use disorderMild to moderate depression
- Hypertension (or at risk for hypertension)
- Diabetes (or at risk for diabetes)
- Adverse childhood experience
