


Our Model of Care



Our Service Area and Conditions of Focus

We are focused exclusively on the West Side of Chicago, specifically in 10 zip codes, that comprise a total population of 571,902. We work with those on Medicaid or who have no health insurance.

We are focused on the following medical or behavioral conditions: • Severe mental illness and those struggling with addiction,

- or a substance use disorder
- Mild to moderate depression
- Hypertension (or at risk for hypertension) • Diabetes (or at risk for diabetes)
- Adverse childhood experience


