Wellness West focuses on six of the most prevalent health conditions on Chicago's West Side. We have developed community-based disease management solutions and integrated care coordination strategies to treat six of the most challenging health conditions on the West Side. They are:



Wellness West Partners with Big Star Transit to Meet Patients' Needs

Wellness West has formed an alliance with Big Star Transit to deliver safe, reliable and no-cost transportation services to eligible Wellness West patients across the West Side.

Many patients face challenges getting to their medical and behavioral health appointments, as well as to places necessary to address social determinants of health, such as grocery stores, job training and appointments for other social service needs. For eligible Wellness West patients, Big Star can make the difference between making or missing a key wellness appointment. This transportation service is available Monday through Friday from 3 a.m. to 8:45 p.m. and on Saturdays and Sundays from 3 a.m. to 7:45 p.m.

Big Star Transit, LLC, is a family owned and operated non-emergency medical transportation company.

Medical Home CHWs

• **Measure:** Increase disease enrollment. How to win: Top 3 agencies with the highest percentage increase. **Winners: Access Community Health Network, Chicago Family Health Center and PCC Community Wellness**

• **Measure:** Disease management monthly contacts. How to win: Reach at least 60% of patients with follow-up assessments in 2 of the 3 disease categories. **Winners: AHS, Community Health, Esperanza and Sinai Chicago**

CBO CHWs

• **Measure:** Closed loop referral. How to win: Top 3 agencies with the highest percentage of closed referrals. **Winners: Equal Hope, North Lawndale Employment Network and Erie Neighborhood House**

ED Navigators

• **Measure:** Increase HRA completion. How to win: Top 2 teams with the highest HRA and referral rate completion. **Winners: Sinai Chicago**

CMHCs (BHCM and Peer Support)

• **Measure:** Hospital discharge follow-up. How to win: 30% of patients discharged in March will receive 7-day successful follow-up. **Winners: Healthcare Alternatives, Rincon and Habilitative Systems**

• **Measure:** Increase in disease management weekly contacts. How to win: Percentage of patients with 2 or more visits at 75% or greater. **Winner: Healthcare Alternatives**

Israt Khan is a Behavioral Health Care Manager at Habilitative Systems, Inc., a Wellness West partner. She has a master's degree in public health.



The most challenging part: "It is disappointing when a client stops engaging with us, despite our best efforts. But we don't give up." She also believes that the first step for patients is often the most difficult.

"Asking for and accepting help can be very scary for patients. But when they do accept help, they are always glad they did. I can hear the relief in their voice."

Esperanza Maquin and her husband Hector live on the West Side of Chicago. They both have suffered from diabetes and hypertension for some time. Hector now receives dialysis treatment while recovering from kidney and heart problems.

Last October, Esperanza met Michel Peñaloza at the church they both attend. The meeting was a blessing because Michel happens to be a Community Health Worker at Alternatives Youth, a Wellness West partner.

Michel explained to Esperanza how the Wellness West program could help her with all kinds of daily challenges she faces, which has a direct impact on her and her husband's health.


Soon Michel had put together a holistic health plan. It included getting Esperanza and her husband to and from medical appointments, a nutritional plan, assistance with shopping for groceries, and assistance with paying their utility bills. Michel even set Esperanza up with Wellness West's Instacart program to have some groceries delivered straight to her door.

All this support is having an impact. Esperanza's health numbers are heading in the right direction. Esperanza and her husband are eating better than they ever have.

Esperanza said: "Michel is very kind and explains clearly and patiently the steps we should follow. She has also helped us navigate the health system and provided us with resources such as access to better nutrition, which is helping us a lot to recover, an improvement that is very noticeable in my husband. Michel has lots of patience. Thanks to her, our health is improving."

Wellness West has expanded its social interventions program by partnering with YMCA of Metropolitan Chicago. Through the partnership, our collaborative will be able to offer eligible Wellness West patients access to daycare services and fitness memberships at YMCA facilities on Chicago's West Side. 
Notable Quotables from the Board
